LAS VEGAS – Cleveland Clinic has named leading researcher and neurologist Jeffery L. Cummings, M.D., Director of the Cleveland Clinic Lou Ruvo Center for Brain Health and also recruited Dylan Wint, M.D. to join the center’s battle against neurocognitive diseases.

Joining the organization on July 1, Dr. Cummings will lead Lou Ruvo Center for Brain Health research and operations in Cleveland and Las Vegas. In his new role, he will be responsible for further developing the center’s research capabilities and clinical programs, including the initiation of new drug development programs for neurodegenerative disorders. Dr. Cummings will also further develop Cleveland Clinic brain health research related to brain injuries and neurorehabilitation.

Dr. Wint is trained and board certified both in psychiatry and neurology, and has committed his professional career to understanding and treating neural-based behavioral disorders. He will participate in clinical and research programs in this area at the Center for Brain Health and will lead the center’s professional education programs. Dr. Wint received his medical degree at the University of Miami School and completed his training at the University of Florida and the National Institutes of Health.
